The overall goal of this phase 2 assessment project is to improve the quality and accuracy of the Lower Columbia Barrier Inventory data and priorities to help meet the needs of local communities, counties, and the state for strategically implementing future barrier correction projects. Benefiting species include ESA-listed lower Columbia summer and winter steelhead, coho, chum, and fall and spring Chinook salmon across the entire Washington portion of the lower Columbia River region.

Hardy Creek Reach 5 Floodplain Reconnection

Cowlitz Indian Tribe



with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, proposes to restore floodplain function to 4.25 acres of riparian habitat and 2,500 feet of Reach 5 of Hardy Creek, located in Pierce National Wildlife Refuge, Skamania County, WA. This project will also restore riparian function by installing over 4,500 native trees and shrubs with a focused effort to install live stakes within 1,750 linear feet of Hardy Creek floodplain. This collaborative will restore natural processes, habitat diversity and complexity to benefit ESA-listed species including lower Columbia steelhead, coho, chum, and Chinook salmon as well as out-of-basin fish.
